2014 - 1 nest - 3 chicks fledged by Sept. 8, 2014

The same pair from the nest that failed, built a new nest on top of old center nest and produced three chicks on or around June 30, 2014. We know it is the same pair because the male in both nests has a tongue injury causing the tongue to protrude like a pencil below its beak.

2015-1 nest- 3 chicks fledged on May 20, 2015- Heron Island

The same male that built the successful nest last year returned with a partner and occupied last year's nest. The pair hatched 3 chicks which all departed by May 20, 2015 from Heron Island.



2015-Nest #1 nest- 3 chicks fledged on May 20, 2015- Heron Island-nests 2, 3 & 4 were unsuccessful.

2015- 1 nest near Waterfall at Stow Lake- 2 chicks fledged on August 4, 2015

Two pair of herons from Heron Island moved over to the Island near the Waterfall at the end of April 2015. Both pair constructed new nests in a Monterey Pine tree. One nest was abandoned in early June, but the other nest was successful. This is the first time that the Great Blue Herons have nested on this tiny island; there are only two trees on the island. Note: there were originally three chicks in the nest, but one disappeared after a few days.

2016- 5 nests on island near Waterfall.



2021 - 8 nests on Heron Island - the tiny island near the waterfall.

Ten chicks fledged from four nests. Two additional nests were occupied and later abandoned. 2 other nests fell into the water.

By June 30, all parents and chicks had departed Stow Lake. The season started with eight active nests. However as the season progressed, nests were abandoned, adult herons stole sticks from the nearby tree with a Red Tail Hawk nest and two nests fell into the lake with chicks aboard as their underlying branches snapped off in heavy winds.

There are two trees on the tiny island. What was once a healthy Monterey Pine Tree for the breeding Great Blue Herons is now dead and many branches with nests have broken off in heavy winds since Nov. 2020. The tree is quite bare.

The adjacent Monterey Pine tree with the Red Tail Hawk nest is healthy and thriving. Perhaps the herons will someday displace the Red Tail Hawks and inhabit their tree for future breeding.

Nest #3- 3 chicks hatched, 1 expired in nest, other 2 perished when nest fell into the water.


Nest #5- 2 chicks hatched, 2 fledged

Nest #7- 3 chicks hatched, 2 fledged before nest fell into water, remaining chick in nest perished.

Nest #8- 2 chicks hatched, 2 expired in nest.

Notes:

- a. Original nest from 1993 fell into Stow Lake and sunk on Jan. 24, 2000 (This nest appears in 'Heron Island' video on YouTube.)
- b. Nest from 1996 fell into a pedal boat on December 31, 1997.
- c. Heron Island 1 (1993-2015) at Stow Lake is located opposite Stow Lake Boathouse.
- d. Heron Island 2 (2015-present) at Stow Lake is located on a small island opposite the Strawberry Island waterfall.

- e. Great Blue Herons began nesting in 1993 at Stow Lake. The colony was discovered by field ornithologist Nancy DeStefanis.
- f. To date, Great Blue Herons have nested successfully on three islands at Stow Lake: Strawberry Island, Heron Island and Waterfall Island.
